### About Our School

Centennial first opened its doors in 1989. Located in the southeast corner of Olympia, we serve students in grades kindergarten through 5th grade. There are typically four classrooms at each grade level, located within three separate pods and seven portables. The pod areas surround the library, which is located at the heart of the building.
