

**LIBRARY MEDIA CENTERS**

Library/media centers will be used to support the attainment of the state’s learning goals. Each center will be provided with a collection of print and electronic information, instructional equipment and other learning resource materials to promote a positive impact on student learning. These resources will support the district’s school improvement plan and student mastery of the essential academic learning requirements in all subject areas.

The teacher-librarian will collaborate as an instructional partners and informational specialist with teachers developing student’s information literacy skills. The teacher-librarian will assist students in meeting content goals in all subject areas and assist high school students with graduation requirements, including the culminating project, Collection of Evidence, and the high school and beyond plans. The teacher-librarian will assist students and teachers by providing access to materials and securing information from other sources.

The Superintendent will establish procedures for the selection of materials. Citizens who wish to express a concern about specific material included in the collection may do so according to the procedures outlined in 2020P.
