

DIPLOMAS FOR VETERANS

The District will issue high school diplomas to an honorably discharged member of the armed forces of the United States who was scheduled to graduate from high school, but who left high school before graduation to serve in World War II, the Korean Conflict or the Vietnam Conflict.

To be eligible for a diploma the veteran or his or her representative must fill out the application provided by the Washington Department of Veteran Affairs and provide evidence of eligibility.

Veterans are eligible for the diploma even if they subsequently earned a high school equivalency certificate or are deceased.

The Superintendent will determine those veterans who have substantial ties to the District. Examples include, but are not limited to, the following: living or having lived in the District, having attended schools in the District, having children or other descendants who have attended school in the District, having been employed by the District, or volunteering in the District.
