About Our School:

Located on a peninsula eight miles north of Olympia, Boston Harbor Elementary School draws its student population from a rural community bordered by the waters of Puget Sound and Henderson Inlet.

The first school building in the Boston Harbor area, originally a summer destination for local residents and vacationers, was built in 1938 as a Work Progress Administration Project during the presidency of Franklin Delano Roosevelt. The current school facility, constructed in 1991, houses students in kindergarten through fifth grade.

The Boston Harbor school community takes pride in its traditions for high parental involvement, an experienced and caring instructional staff, and commitment to student achievement. Our instructional efforts are focused on developing a school-wide writing plan and supporting students who may be struggling in the core academic areas of reading, mathematics, writing, and science.

2005-06 School Facts:

Based on the October 1, 2005 enrollment report, there are 189 students enrolled at Boston Harbor Elementary with an ethnic composition of:

There are 50.8% male students and 49.2% female students. The student attendance rate is 98.2%.

Our School Improvement Plan:

GOAL 1: READING

Improve student reading comprehension and analysis to increase the percentage of students meeting standard on the WASL from 93% to 96% by spring of 2007 and to 100% by spring of 2008.

GOAL 2: WRITING

Improve student writing (Content/Organization/Style and Conventions) to increase the percentage of students meeting standard on the WASL from 63% to 75% by spring of 2007 and to 85% by spring of 2008.

GOAL 3: MATH

Improve student mathematics content and process skills to increase the percentage of students meeting standard on the WASL from 70% to 80% by spring of 2007 and to 95% by spring of 2008.

GOAL 4: SCIENCE

Improve student science content knowledge and process skills to increase the percentage of students meeting standard on the WASL from 45% to 60% by spring of 2007 and to 75% by spring of 2008.
