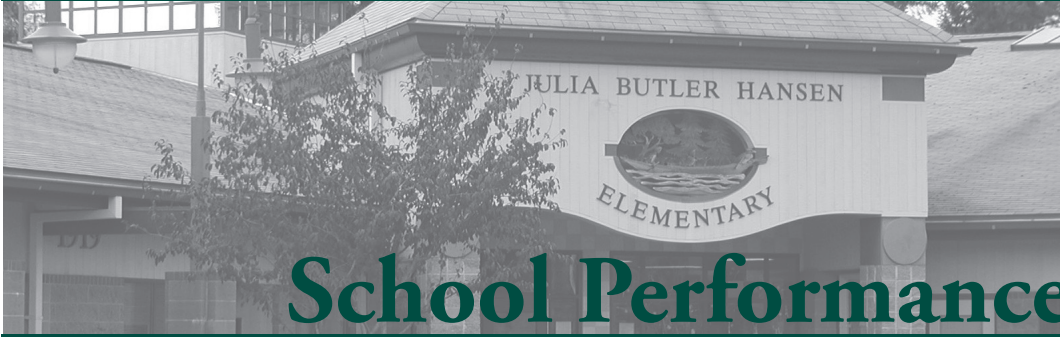

Mission Statement:

Julia Butler Hansen Elementary School is dedicated to the success of all students which requires full partnerships with parents, community, and families united in teamwork and committed to continuous growth and change as a community of learners. Through these processes, we seek to both model for, and instill in our students, a value of lifelong learning and the skills necessary to be responsible contributing citizens of our society.

About Our School:

Julia Butler Hansen Elementary, which opened in September 1994, is located on Olympia's west side. Hansen Elementary was named for Congresswoman Julia Butler Hansen. Mrs. Hansen was elected to the House of Representatives in 1939. In 1960, she was elected to an unexpired term in the House and re-elected each succeeding session. Hansen's current enrollment includes over 500 students in preschool through fifth grade. The school contains classrooms, which are housed in three pods of four to six classrooms, as well as two adjoining classrooms. The physical structure of the facility provides individual classrooms with the flexibility to allow team, multi-age, and multi-year teaching situations (i.e., retractable doors between many classrooms). Separate space is also available for classroom activities, ESL support, and a student computer lab. The facility includes a Learning Resource Center, Hansen Family Services center, as well as a gymnasium, a multipurpose room, and a music room. One of the three pods houses a multi-age cluster where emphasized parent involvement is the alternative choice for our community (i.e., Hansen Alternative Program).

Hansen Elementary is inclusive in promoting the success of all students. Therefore, we encourage full parental partnership and welcome community participation. If you are interested in joining our Hansen Community Council, please call 596-7400. We look forward to seeing you!

Based on the October 1, 2005 enrollment report, there are 504 students enrolled at Hansen Elementary with an ethnic composition of:

There are 46.6% male students and 53.4% female students. The student attendance rate is 97.8%.

Hansen has a total of 25 certificated teachers.

All of our teachers and paraeducators are highly qualified. Hansen meets the Adequate Yearly Progress for No Child Left Behind.

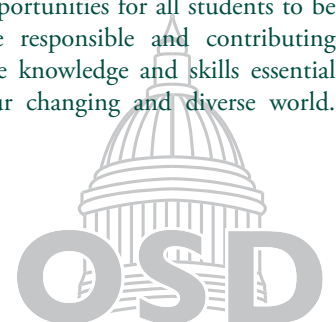

Our School Improvement Plan:

GOAL 1: READING

Increase the percentage of students meeting the standard on the 4th grade WASL in Reading to 89.0 in 2007.

GOAL 2: WRITING

Increase percentage of students meeting the standard on the 4th grade Writing WASL to 63.0 in 2007.

GOAL 3: MATH - Increase the percentage of students meeting the standard on the 4th grade Math WASL to 59.0 in 2007. Students scoring below the scoring levels 1 and 2 on the WASL in Math. Align action to Grade Level Expectations (GLE) for math.

GOAL 4: SCIENCE - Increase student performance in science as measured by formal and informal assessments. Students scoring below levels 1 and 2 on the WASL in Science. . Align instruction to Grade Level Expectations (GLE) for Science.
