Mission Statement:

Julia Butler Hansen Elementary School is dedicated to the success of all students which requires full partnerships with parents, community, and families united in teamwork and committed to continuous growth and change as a community of learners. Through these processes, we seek to both model for, and instill in our students, a value of lifelong learning and the skills necessary to be responsible contributing citizens of our society.

About Our School:

Julia Butler Hansen Elementary, which opened in September 1994, the newest elementary school in Olympia School District, is located on Olympia's west side. Hansen Elementary was named for Congresswoman Julia Butler Hansen. Mrs. Hansen was elected to the House of Representatives in 1939. In 1960, she was elected to an unexpired term in the House and reelected each succeeding session. Hansen's current enrollment includes nearly 500 students in preschool through fifth grade. The school contains twenty classrooms, which are housed in three pods of four to six classrooms, as well as two adjoining classrooms. The physical structure of the facility provides individual classrooms with the flexibility to allow team, multi-age, and multi-year teaching situations (i.e., retractable doors between many classrooms). Separate space is also available for classroom activities, ESL support, and a student computer lab. The facility includes a Learning Resource Center (library), Hansen Family Services center, as well as a gymnasium, a multipurpose room, and a music room. One of the three pods houses a multi-age cluster where emphasized parent involvement is the alternative choice for our community (i.e., Hansen Alternative Program).
