Mission Statement:

Our mission is to provide our students with solid foundation in the basic academic skill areas, while exposing them to a diverse selection of hands-on and academic electives.

About Our School:

Jefferson is a three-grade middle school (6, 7, 8) on the west side of Olympia. It was first established as a junior high school and later, when the district changed its philosophy, Jefferson made the transition to a middle school. The building was remodeled in 1994 to reorganize the classroom and common use space, update and enlarge the library, and prepare the building for technology.

In (2005-06) Jefferson had an enrollment of nearly 400 students from urban and suburban communities, with families living in apartments and single family homes. Our students come from a multitude of cultures: Native American, Hispanic, Asian American, African America and Caucasian. Enrollment by gender shows 46.5% female and 53.5% male.

Jefferson houses the middle level English Language Learners (ELL) program for the Olympia School District.

2005-06 School Facts:

Based on the October 1, 2005 enrollment report, there are 398 students enrolled at Jefferson Middle School with an ethnic composition of:

African American	4.3%
American Indian	1.8%
Asian American	10.8%
Caucasian	77.4%
Hispanic	4.3%

There are 53.5% male students and 46.5% female students. The student attendance rate is 98.2%.

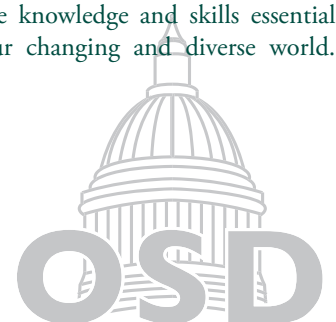

Improve students' skills and understanding of reading as measured by standardized and grade-level classroom-based assessments and increase the percentage of students meeting the standard on the WASL from 75.2% to meet or exceed 80% by June 2007.

GOAL 2: WRITING

Students will be able to achieve academic success in every area of writing to reach the State WASL goal of 73% by 2007.

GOAL 3: MATH

Students achieve academic success in every area of mathematics as well as 67.5% of the students reaching the WASL standard in 2007.

GOAL 4: SCIENCE

Students achieve academic success in every area of science as well as 67% of the students reaching the WASL standard in 2007.
