### About Our School:

The Options Program at Lincoln School offers an alternative approach to elementary education that is a choice for students in the Lincoln Service Area and from the Olympia School District. The program provides a unified model for grades K-5 that respects how children learn and views learning as a collaborative effort of staff, students and parents. Attributes of the Options Program include:

- Social-emotional growth and academic growth are equally valued
- Children stay with the same teacher in multi-age classrooms for two years or more to support their learning and strengthen family-school relationship
- Learning is integrated through concept development
- Multiple intelligences, cooperation, social justice and sustainability are taught and practiced
- Parents are vital to sustaining the Options program and are involved in governance, as partners supporting learning in the classroom, enrichment activities, field trips, fund raising, and social events

### 2005-06 School Facts:

Based on the October 1, 2005 enrollment report, there are 280 students enrolled at Lincoln Elementary School with an ethnic composition of:

African American	3.9%

There are 51.1% male students and 48.9% female students. The student attendance rate is 95.66%.
