Mission Statement:

It is the mission of Madison Elementary School to create a nurturing environment for students, their families, staff, and the community which encourages caring, respect, academic excellence, lifelong learning, and citizenship.

About Our School:

Madison Elementary School is an exciting place to learn and grow. Each day over 190 preschool through fifth grade eager and talented students, nearly 30 dedicated staff members and a number of committed volunteers enter Madison ready to have a day filled with learning and friendship.

The school building, which is the pride of the community, opened for the first time in its current location on Legion Way in September 1999, replacing a 44-year-old building on Central Street. The school was designed to fit into the Eastside neighborhood by matching the peaked roofs of the nearby houses and the Spanish-style architecture of the Olympia School District Knox Administration Center on the same campus.

Our programs are designed to give every child the opportunity for success both academically and socially. Our motto is "Succeed with Pride." Notable is our Welcome Room program for students who experience a high rate of mobility. Equally important are the community partnerships we enjoy which strengthen both our school and our community. We are proud of our continued efforts in improving our reading, writing, math, and science WASL scores. Madison Elementary is realizing the dream that all children can succeed.

Based on the October 1, 2005 enrollment report, there are 192 students enrolled at Madison Elementary School with an ethnic composition of:

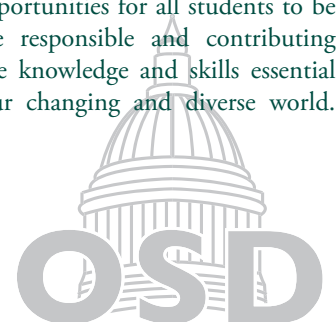

Our School Improvement Plan:

GOAL 1: READING - Increase the number of students who meet the WASL standard in reading to 96% in 2007 and 98% in 2008.

GOAL 2: WRITING - Increase the number of students who meet the WASL standard in writing to 78% in 2007 and 80% in 2008.

GOAL 3: MATH - Increase the number of students who meet the WASL standard in math to 78% in 2007 and 80% in 2008.

GOAL 4: SCIENCE - Increase the number of students who meet the WASL standards in science to 78% in 2007 and 80% in 2008.

SAFE AND INCLUSIVE SCHOOL AND FAMILY/COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT GOALS:

1. Decrease number of student discipline referrals from 2006 from 233 to 150 in 2007.
2. Increase family involvement in school events as measured by 50% participation.
3. Increase number of after school activities to at least 2 classes per month.
4. Participate in Parent Education Consortium in which other Title I schools collaborate their efforts in parent training.
