GOAL 1: READING - The percentage of students scoring below Level 3 on the Reading portion of the 2005-06 Washington Assessment of Student Learning will be decreased by three percent on the 2006-07 test.

GOAL 2: WRITING - The percentage of students scoring below Level 3 on the Writing portion of the 2005-06 Washington Assessment of Student Learning will be decreased by three percent on the 2006-07 test.

GOAL 3: MATH - The percentage of students scoring below Level 3 on the Mathematics portion of the 2005-06 Washington Assessment of Student Learning will be decreased by three percent on the 2006-07 test.

GOAL 4: SCIENCE - The percentage of students scoring below Level 3 on the Science portion of the 2005-06 Washington Assessment of Student Learning will be decreased by three percent on the 2006-07 test.
