About Our School:

Thurgood Marshall Middle School, the newest of the four Olympia middle schools, opened its doors in the fall of 1994. Through a yearlong "Design Team" planning process involving staff, administrators, parents, community members, and students during the 1993-94 school year, a comprehensive plan was developed which will continue to be refined via an ongoing evaluation process. The major elements contained in this plan are based on current research and practice related to effective learning for middle level students. These elements are:

- Curriculum integration
- Connecting curriculum and instruction to "real life"
- Integrated opportunities for community service and learning responsible citizenship
- Strong parent - school communication
- Flexible scheduling
- Technology as a learning tool
- Challenging instructional program

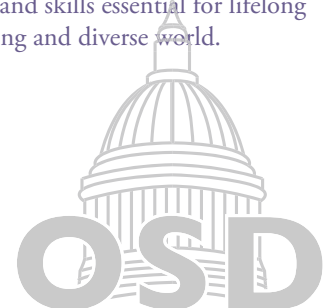
