Margaret McKenny Elementary was built in southeast Olympia, in the middle of a field filled with yellow scotch broom and hawks nesting in trees. Thus, the HAWKS became the perfect McKenny mascot.

Architecturally, the building is designed into three pods of 19 classrooms. Grade level teachers and support staff work together to provide the best possible learning environment for all of our children, preschool through grade 5. McKenny Elementary welcomes parent and community volunteers to assist in all aspects of our educational and co-curricular day. The facility is used daily by community groups such as, YMCA, Olympia Parks and Recreation, Boy Scouts, Campfire Girls, PTO and neighborhood associations.
