Olympia High School Mission Statement

We, the Olympia High School Community, are dedicated to personal excellence and responsible citizenship.

About Our School

Olympia High School is described as one of the oldest public secondary schools in the state. Since its beginning, it has been recognized for quality teaching, strong parent and community support, high student achievement and excellent facilities.

The first Olympia High School was built in 1906-07, on what is today the Washington State Capitol Campus. In 1918, the building burned down. The second school was built in 1918-1919, located approximately at Capitol Way and 13th Avenue. In 1949, forty acres of the Clover Fields Dairy Farm in Southeast Olympia was purchased by the School District. This is the location of the current Olympia High School. Construction began on the current site in 1958-1961. Olympia High School has undergone a complete renovation, and was rededicated on October 28, 2000.

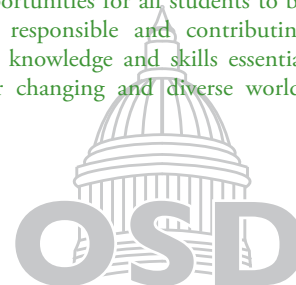

Our School Improvement Plan

- ▶ **GOAL 1 & 2: Reading and Writing Reading-** Our goal is to have at least 97% of our students meet the WASL Reading and Writing standard and have 0 far misses for tenth graders in the Reading and Writing portion of the WASL. Our goal is to have 100% of our existing students meet the reading and Writing standard by 12th grade and at least 99% to meet standard by 11th grade. We will reduce the number of failures in all humanities and health classes to under 4%.
- ▶ **GOAL 3: Math-** For the Class of 2009, at least 90% of our students will meet the WASL math standard. For the Class of 2010, at least 82% of our students will meet the WASL math standard. For the class of 2011, at least 80% of our students will meet the WASL math standard. We will also reduce the number of failures in math classes to under 4%.
- ▶ **GOAL 4: SCIENCE-** For the Class of 2011, at least 70% of our students will meet the WASL science standard. At least 90% of our students who are enrolled Biology will pass the science WASL. We will reduce the number of failures in science classes to under 4%.
