### Mission Statement:

We believe that Reeves Middle School fosters thinking, learning and responsibility in our students and staff. Through diverse programs, we promote mutual respect, a sense of self-worth and an appreciation for lifelong learning. Our school provides opportunities for every student to make decisions and to know their consequences. We recognize the value of individual contributions to the larger community.

### About Our School:

Reeves Middle School serves over 400 students in 6th, 7th, and 8th grades, most of whom have come to us from Madison, Roosevelt, and Boston Harbor Elementary schools. We provide a unique program designed to help our young adolescents make a successful transition from the dependence of childhood to the confidence and independence required of high school students. This program consists of a Humanities Block class (which includes language arts, social studies and reading) where the student remains with one teacher and the same group of classmates for three periods: math; physical education; science; and exploratory classes, which are designed to allow the students to test their interest and skills in a variety of occupational and artistic areas.

### 2005-06 School Facts:

Based on the October 1, 2005 enrollment report, there are 407 students enrolled at Reeves Middle School with an ethnic composition of:

There are 49.4% male students and 50.6% female students. The student attendance rate is 98.1%.

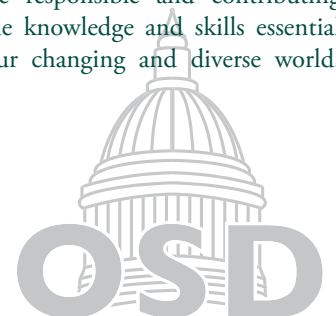

## Our School Improvement Plan:

**GOAL 1: LANGUAGE ARTS** - Improve all students' academic achievement in language arts through strategies targeted to increase meaningful learning and student performance as demonstrated by higher test scores. Tests will include classroom assessments, OlyAlt, and WASL. One measure of success will be to raise the number of students who pass the Reading WASL from 78.4% to 83%. We will also attempt to raise the number of students passing the Writing WASL from 73.0% to 78%.

**GOAL 2: MATH** - Improve students' academic achievement in math through strategies targeted to increase meaningful learning and improve student WASL performance from 58.9% meeting standard in 2006 to 64% meeting standard in 2007.

**GOAL 3: SCIENCE** - Improve students' academic achievement in science as demonstrated by increasing the number of students meeting standard on the WASL from 46.1% to 55%.

**GOAL 4: CITIZENSHIP** - Promote active student citizenship in the school and community, as well as strengthen and enhance the connections between school and home. This goal will be measured by (1) increasing student participation in school activities; and, (2) decreasing student discipline referrals. This school year will provide us with a baseline number to use in gauging success in upcoming years.
