We believe that Reeves Middle School fosters thinking, learning and responsibility in our students and staff. Through diverse programs, we promote mutual respect, a sense of self-worth and an appreciation for lifelong learning. Our school provides opportunities for every student to make decisions and to know their consequences. We recognize the value of individual contributions to the larger community.

About Our School:

Reeves Middle School serves 430 students in 6th, 7th, and 8th grades, most of whom have come to us from Madison, Roosevelt, and Boston Harbor Elementary schools. We provide a unique program designed to help our young adolescents make a successful transition from the dependence of childhood to the confidence and independence required of high school students. This program consists of a Humanities Block class (which includes language arts, social studies and reading) where the student remains with one teacher and the same group of classmates for three periods: math; physical education; science; and exploratory classes, which are designed to allow the students to test their interest and skills in a variety of occupational and artistic areas.
