Mission Statement:

Through an active partnership among staff, students, and parents, the mission of Roosevelt Elementary School is to provide a safe, enjoyable, and challenging environment where all children develop the skills and enthusiasm necessary for lifelong learning.

About Our School:

Roosevelt Elementary School has served the residents of northeast Olympia since 1908. The current building was built in 1989, and during the 2005-06 school year, we served approximately 361 students in grades kindergarten through fifth grade. A diverse ethnic and socioeconomic mix of students and families enriches our school.

Roosevelt School is physically organized into three instructional pods with a total of seventeen classrooms. Each pod shares a central common area. Our school facility also has a gym, a multipurpose room with a kitchen, a music room, our 'Success for All' reading resource room, and a learning resource center (library). In addition to classroom teachers, we have a reading facilitator, a teacher tutor, a support teacher and a Social Service Provider (counselor). Also, we have Paraeducators on our staff to help promote student achievement and school safety. Vocal music, band and orchestra classes are taught by district specialists.

We are the host site for the Thurston-Mason County Head Start Program that serves approximately forty students.

We are proud of the programs in place to develop the academic, social and emotional capabilities and the success we have had in meeting the needs of this diverse student population

2005-06 School Facts:

Based on the October 1, 2005 enrollment report, there are 361 students enrolled at Roosevelt Elementary School with an ethnic composition of:

African American	2.5%

There are 49.3% male students and 50.7% female students. The student attendance rate is 97.99%.

Roosevelt has a total of 21 certificated teachers.

All of our teachers and paraeducators are highly qualified. Roosevelt meets the Adequate Yearly Progress for No Child Left Behind.

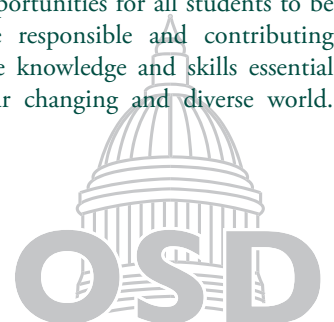

Our School Improvement Plan:

GOAL 1: READING - Roosevelt will continue with its current reading program using 'Success For All' which includes 90 minutes of reading daily, school-wide groups, tutoring for its lowest 30% of first grade, 20% of second grade, 10% of others, etc. 95% of students who have attended Roosevelt at least one year will enter third grade reading at grade level, and at least 90% of fourth grade students will meet the reading standard on the WASL

GOAL 2: WRITING - On the spring 2006-07 WASL, 80% of students who have attended Roosevelt at least one year will meet standard on the fourth grade writing.

GOAL 3: MATH - On the spring of 2006-07 WASL, at least 73% of students who have attended Roosevelt at least one year will meet standard on the third, fourth and fifth grade math WASL. The percentage of students meeting standard will increase at a rate of 30% per year until at least 90% of the students meet the Math WASL standard.

GOAL 4: SCIENCE - On the spring 2006-07 WASL, at least 58% of Roosevelt 5th grade students who have attended Roosevelt at least one year will meet standard on the fifth grade science WASL. The percentage of students meeting standard will increase at a rate of 3% per year until at least 90% of the students meet the Math WASL standard.
