Mission Statement:

Washington Middle School is committed to creating a positive learning environment where organized structures and processes promote academic excellence, developmental responsiveness, and social equity to all students.

About Our School:

Our school is located in the southeast portion of the City of Olympia. Our school population nearly 700 students in grades 6, 7 and 8.

Our program is based on grade level teams covering the subjects of reading, writing, social studies, math and science. In addition to these core classes, our students attend a rotation semester of PE, Home Arts, Tech Arts and Health. Finally, one elective class of Chorus, Band, Orchestra, or a rotation of hands-on activity classes round out the average student's day. Students are challenged to their greatest ability through differentiated instruction in every class and a variety of math options through the geometry level. Conversely, students are also given multiple opportunities to obtain support for their learning through study skills classes and special education programs that are designed to meet the individual needs of the learners. We operate a technology-rich curriculum with every subject area integrating the use of technology as appropriate. Our widespread use of technology and multimedia in our school exceeds the basic curricular and technology goals of the Olympia School District and the Washington State Essential Academic Learning Requirements.

Based on the October 1, 2005 enrollment report, there are 695 students enrolled at Washington Middle School with an ethnic composition of:

Our School Improvement Plan:

GOAL 1: READING - The 2006 WASL reading results show 80% met the standard. Our goal for 2007 performance in reading is to have at least 90% and we expect to reach the goal of 98% in 2008.

GOAL 2: WRITING -The 2006 WASL writing results show 86% met the standard. Our goal for 2007 performance in writing is to have at least 90% and we expect to reach the goal of 95% in 2007.

GOAL 3: MATH - The 2006 WASL math results show 72% met the standard. Our goal for 2007 performance in math is to have at least 80% and we expect to reach the goal of 85% in 2008.

GOAL 4: SCIENCE - The 2006 WASL science results show 71% met the standard. Our goal for 2007 performance in science is to have at least 80% and we expect to reach the goal of 90% in 2008.
