About Our School

Madison Elementary School is an exciting place to learn and grow. Eager and talented preschool through fifth grade students, dedicated staff members and committed volunteers enter Madison ready to have a day filled with learning and friendship.

The school building opened for the first time in its current location on Legion Way in September 1999, replacing a 44-year-old building on Central Street. The school was designed to fit into the Eastside neighborhood by matching the peaked roofs of the nearby houses and the Spanish-style architecture of the Knox Administrative Center on the same campus.

Our programs are designed to give every child the opportunity for success both academically and socially. Our motto is "Succeed with Pride." Notable is our Welcome Room program for students who experience a high rate of mobility. Equally important are the community partnerships we enjoy which strengthen both our school and our community. We are proud of our continued efforts in improving our reading, writing, math, and science WASL scores. Madison Elementary is realizing the dream that all children can succeed.

Madison is a school-wide Title I School. All of our teachers and paraeducators are highly qualified. Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) is a cornerstone of the federal No Child Left Behind Act and it monitors student achievement from year-to-year. There are 37 separate indicators for AYP and Madison Elementary School met 36 of the 37 indicators. The area not meeting AYP was in the unexcused absence rate. Madison is committed to working on all areas of AYP so each child is guaranteed a high-quality education.

- ▶ **GOAL 1: READING** - By the end of 2008, 85% of the 3rd graders, 85% of the 4th graders, and 85% of the 5th graders will meet or exceed the WASL standards in reading.
- ▶ **GOAL 2: WRITING** - By the end of 2008, 75% of the 4th graders will meet or exceed the WASL standards in writing.
- ▶ **GOAL 3: MATH** - By the end of 2008, 80% of the 3rd graders, 80% of the 4th graders, and 80% of the 5th graders will meet or exceed the WASL standards in math.
- ▶ **GOAL 4: SCIENCE** - By the end of 2008, 65% of the 5th graders will meet or exceed the WASL standards in science.
