## **HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS**

Students who attend district high schools will successfully complete the following for graduation:

- 22 credits that meet the requirements of the state through the graduating class of 2020. The class of 2021 and beyond will be required to complete 24 credits that meet the state requirements.
- Required state assessments that demonstrate competency or approved alternatives, and
- A High School and Beyond Plan

The Superintendent will establish procedures to allow a substitution of a credit requirement, as allowed by the state, in favor of a requirement that more suitably meets the need of a student.
