Students in Foster Care

The Olympia School District acknowledges the crucial role we play in supporting the well-being of students in foster care and their families. We are committed to the goal that we can and will improve the educational outcomes and well-being of these particularly vulnerable students. To this end, we are committed to coordinate efforts to ensure the educational stability of students in foster care by working in partnership with foster families as well as with state and supporting agencies to this end.

The board recognizes that students in foster care often experience mobility in and out of the foster care system and from one home placement to another that disrupts their education, thereby creating barriers to academic success and on-time graduation. Through collaboration with state, local and/or tribal child welfare agencies, the district will strive to minimize or eliminate educational barriers for students in foster care, particularly with regard to enrollment, transfer of student records, and transportation to their school of origin.

The superintendent or designee is authorized to establish procedures and/or practices for implementing this policy.
