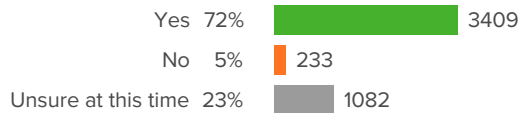

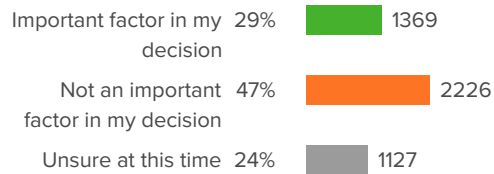
How did people respond?

Q.1: If schools can reopen according to state guidance, do you intend to send your student to campus for in-person learning in the fall of 2020 either part time or full time?



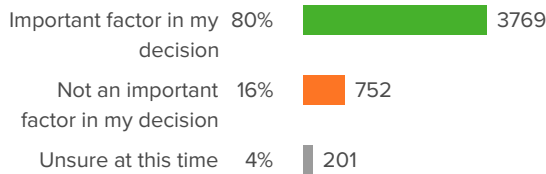
Favorable: **94%**

Q.2: When considering whether your child(ren) will physically attend school either part time or full time, how important of a factor is: COVID-19 vaccine availability.



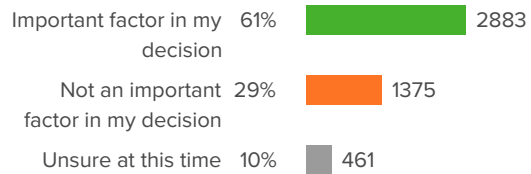
Favorable: **38%**

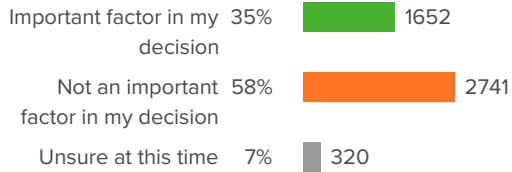
Q.4: When considering whether your child(ren) will physically attend school either part time or full time, how important of a factor is: Limiting classroom seating to maintain social distancing.

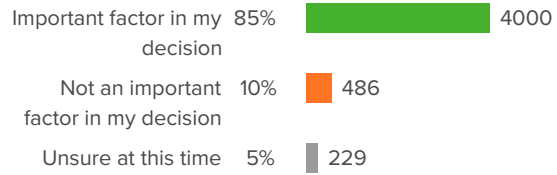

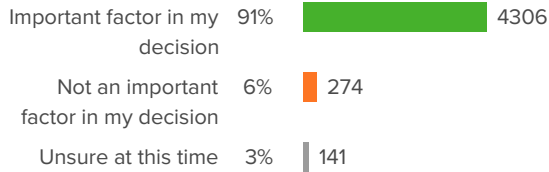

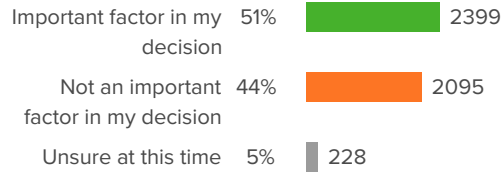

Q.8: When considering whether your child(ren) will physically attend school either part time or full time, how important of a factor is: My ability to work from home/having supervision for my child(ren).



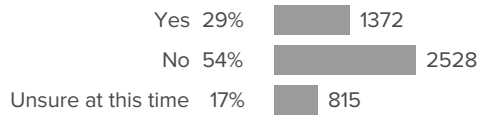

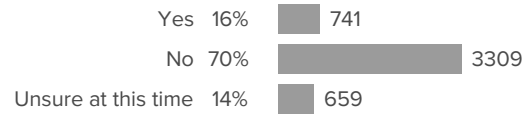
Meal Plan Programs

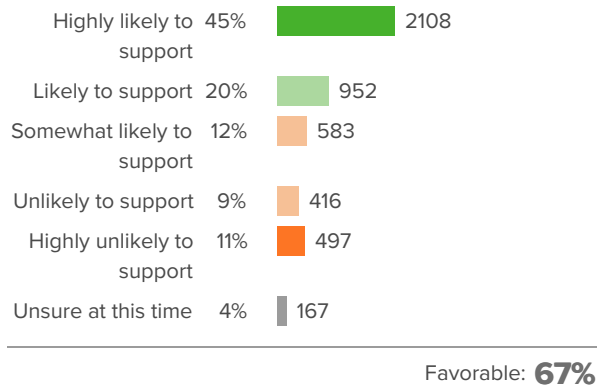

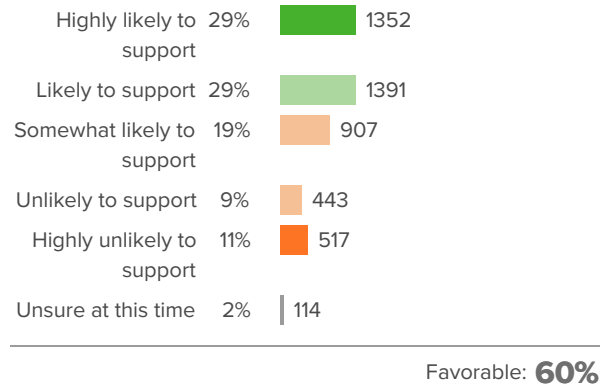

How did people respond?

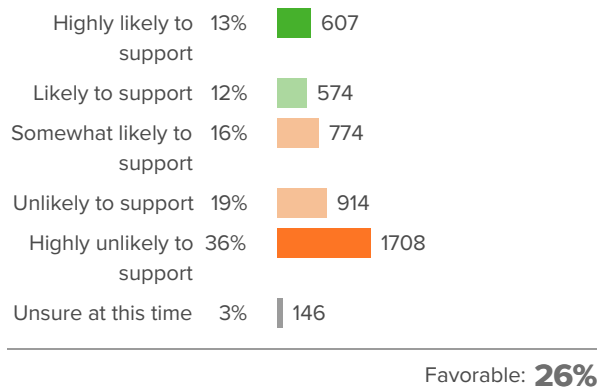
Q.1: Physically at school full time while adhering to the guidelines set forth by the CDC (social distancing, hand washing, etc.).



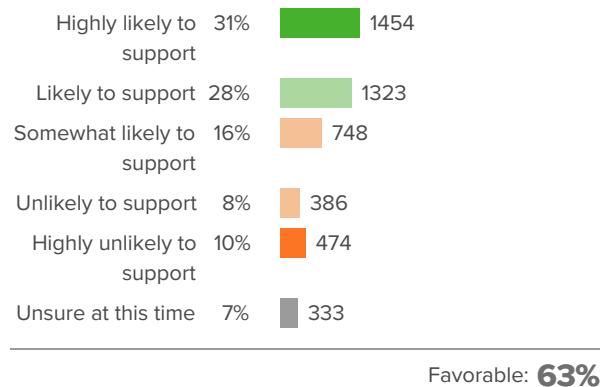
Q.2: Blended learning, which includes students attending school physically part time during assigned days, as well as receiving instruction via distance learning methods on other days to reduce contact with others.



Q.3: Distance learning exclusively at home with teachers delivering content remotely.

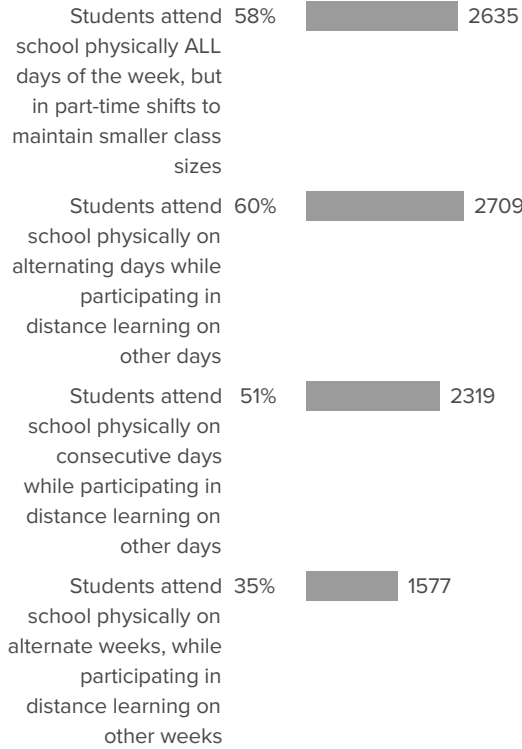

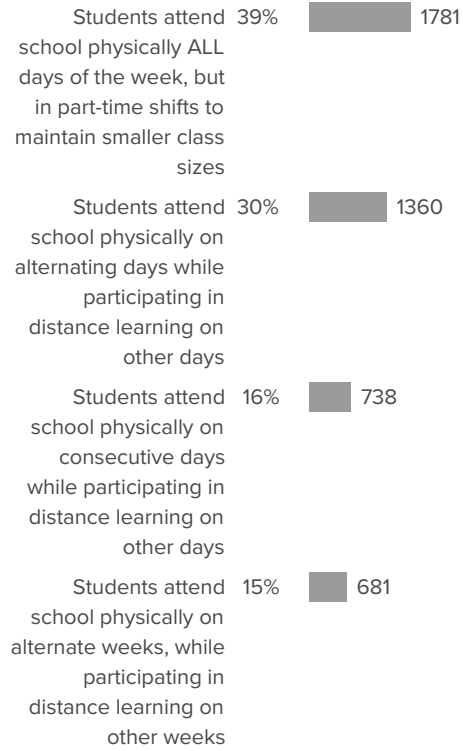




Q.5: Which of the following blended learning models (learning in-person and online) would you support for the fall? (Select all that apply.)

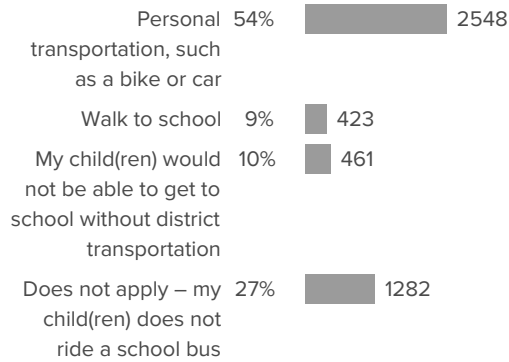




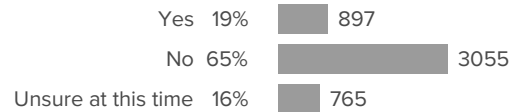

Q.2: If the school district had a blended learning schedule, would you need child care on days your child participated in distance learning?

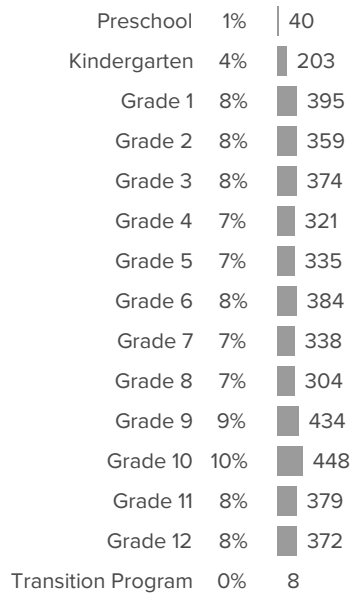




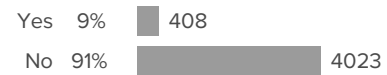

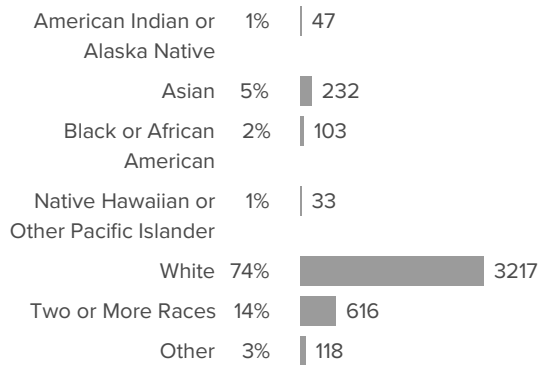

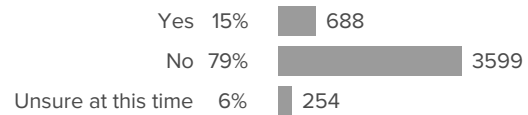
Q.2: Is your student of Hispanic or Latino origin?

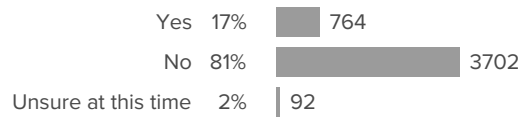
