Glossary of Terms

- Synchronous: Live session in Zoom (whole group, small group, individual) where teachers and students interact in a live way.
- Asynchronous: Independent work time for students. Watching pre-recorded content, working on classwork either digitally or paper pencil work.
- Morning Meeting: Whole group meeting for morning check-in. Content can include, but is not limited to: SEL learning, Weekly Second Step lesson, Number Corner, community-building activities, attendance taking, etc.
- Attendance: Prior to the morning meeting, students/families will log into the OSD Portal to complete the attendance check in.
- Core Instruction Time: (Reading, Writing, Math, Science, Social Studies, and Second Steps) Small groups work in Zoom with classroom teachers, focused on one content area at a time. Core time is regularly scheduled and consistent for families, and may be a combination of synchronous and asynchronous learning. Students are practicing new skills with teachers during core instruction time. Whole group instruction can happen, but all students must be present or have access.



Glossary of Terms, continued

- Intervention/Enrichment Time: Small group time. This is time for Special Education, LAP, EL, Intervention/Enrichment, etc., to pull small groups of students. Classroom teachers and support staff are also pulling a small group of students.
- Specialist Time: Music, PE, Art, Library. Classroom teachers are not required to attend. Sessions will be a combination of synchronous and asynchronous time. Teacher Librarians will begin the year developing a plan for book reservation and check-out before providing instruction.
- Office Hours: Time for teachers to connect one-on-one with students or families to support their educational journey. Priority given to those furthest from educational justice.
- Flipped Classroom: Students engage in new learning through pre-recorded videos prior to attending a live session with the teacher. During the live session, students spend time applying the skill they learned in an asynchronous setting.

Transportation Plan

- If you live more than one (1) mile from school, you can request bus transportation to your neighborhood school when you register your child. All other requests for transportation are reviewed on an individual basis.
- All kindergartners must be met at the bus stop by an authorized adult every day. We do not transport from childcare facilities outside of the Olympia School District, nor does enrollment in a childcare facility that has close proximity to a school ensure enrollment.

Tips for the Transition from Preschool to Kindergarten

- Consult with your child's preschool teacher about current skills and potential future needs.
- Register at your neighborhood school.
- Update your child's immunizations.
- Continue to read with your child, engage in imaginative play, point out environmental print and numbers.

Preparing for Kindergarten

- Engage in play that fosters cooperation and socialization.
- Continue to read; engage in imaginative play; look for printed letters and numbers in your community with your child.
- Consult with your child's daycare or preschool teacher about current skills and potential future needs.
- Visit your child's health care provider.
- Before and After School Planning.
- Think ahead about what your child will do both before and after school to coincide with your family's needs.
 - Y-Care before and after school
 - Boys and Girls Club
 - Area Childcare Facilities
 - Carpooling
 - OSD bus Transportation


Registration Includes:

- -Application for Enrollment
- -Home Language Survey
- -Student Housing Questionnaire
- -Verification of Residency
- -Student Health Information
- -Immunization Status (CIS and COE)
- -Transportation Information
- -Kindergarten Transition Information

Family Provides:

- -Child's Birth Certificate (State issued certificate for verification of meeting age requirements)
- -Child must be five (5) years of age on or before August 31, 2021
- -Immunization records and Health Information
- -Proof of Residency (utility bill)

Paperwork is required for immunizations, medications at school, emergency action plans for illness (lifethreatening allergies, food allergies, asthma, seizures, etc.). Please check with the school nurse if you have any questions related to the Olympia School District Health Services.
